

BALED LINENS CRITERIA

ITEMS TO INCLUDE IN THE BALES:

Comforters

Blankets

Bed Sheets

Pillowcases

Towels

Lace Curtains

NO HEAVY DRAPERIES

CREDENTIAL RAGS

Credential clothing are donations that never cycle through the your store. They are not sorted and no clothing items or accessories are removed. These donations should be baled in the bags in which they were donated. Credential Clothing sells for a higher price due to the higher yield associated with it. A mixture of men's clothing, women's clothing, kid's clothing, shoes, belts & purses, and other items are often found in the bags.

DO NOT INCLUDE IN THE BALES:

GLASS ITEMS

Pat over the bags for any sharp objects or glass and remove it leaving everything else in the bag.

This clothing is resold to third world nations in Africa and parts of Central and South America. It is essential to the buyers to have something worth reselling. The buyers are taking their chances with the purchase of these bales in the understanding that these are unsorted donations.

Loose clothing can also be included in the bales to help shape and hold it together. Cardboard on each side of the bale works to keep the bale intact as well.

HARD & SOFT TOYS GUIDELINES

Toys should be medium to smaller in size and in good condition. They should not be more than 12” in height. The hard toys donations should be placed in Gaylord boxes for shipping and the soft toys can be in bags or baled.

EXCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

BROKEN ITEMS

BOOKS & MEDIA (CDs, DVDs, etc.)

ELECTRONICS

ITEMS OVER 12” IN HEIGHT

MIXED RAGS CRITERIA

A good salable bale should be made up of any usable clothing in good condition. This clothing must be kept as clean as possible. It is also imperative that you DO NOT separate out the cottons and jeans. Additionally, **do not** include socks, uniforms, neckties, plastic raincoats, ripped or torn items, or those that are badly stained.

This clothing is resold to third world nations in Africa and parts of Central and South America. It is essential to the buyers to have something worth reselling. The buyers are taking their chances with the purchase of these bales in the understanding that these are not picked over for any items other than those sold in your stores. Also, the buyers are trusting that the bales do not contain a large amount of unusable goods.

DO NOT INCLUDE IN THE BALES:

SINGLE SOCKS
NECKTIES
PLASTIC RAINCOATS
UNIFORMS
CUT OR TORN ITEMS
BADLY STAINED ITEMS
PILLOWS
DRAPERIES

BRIC-A-BRAC GUIDELINES

Bric-a-Brac is household items such as glassware, vases, picture frames, and kitchen items. These donations should be placed in Gaylord boxes for shipping.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

**POTS AND PANS
SILVERWARE
KITCHENWARE
DECORATIVE ITEMS
PLASTICWARE**

EXCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

**BROKEN ITEMS
ELECTRONICS
BOOKS & MEDIA (CDs, DVDs, etc.)
LARGE ITEMS OVER 12 INCHES**

We Accept:

- ✓ Wearable Paired Shoes
- ✓ Athletic Shoes
- ✓ Dress Shoes
- ✓ Flats
- ✓ Sandals



We Do NOT Accept:

- ✗ Unpaired/Single Shoes
- ✗ Winter/Ski Boots
- ✗ High Heels (above 1 inch)
- ✗ Flip Flops
- ✗ Roller/Ice Skates
- ✗ Boots
